

# Cognitive Verbs in Questions

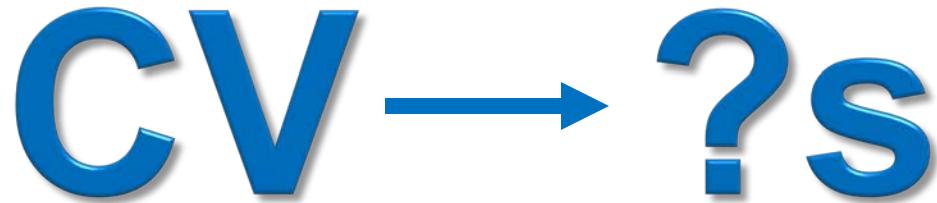

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## Definition

- Using cognitive verbs in questions. Instead of asking, “Who can tell me...” ask, “Who can recall...” “Who can distinguish...” “Who can predict...” “Who can Infer...”

## Goals

- Use cognitive verbs in 75% of all questions asked in class and maintain high questioning frequency during instructional segments of lessons.

## Benefits

- Students become familiar with important terminology.
- Teachers can monitor the levels of their questions.
- Students get a wider range of practice with thinking levels.
- Students understand more precisely what a teacher is asking.

# **Cognitive Verbs in Questions**

|                   |               |   |
|-------------------|---------------|---|
| Critical Thinking | To Justify    | Who can judge, decide, infer, conclude, interpret...          |
| Creative Thinking | To Change     | Who can generate, hypothesize, speculate, imagine, adapt...   |
| Analysis          | To Examine    | Who can isolate, determine, compare, contrast, distinguish... |
| Application       | To Use        | Who can classify, apply, organize, summarize, categorize...   |
| Comprehension     | To Understand | Who can explain, describe, paraphrase, clarify, express...    |
| Knowledge         | To Recall     | Who can remember, list, recognize, recount, restate...        |
